2ND LCSD GOAL COMPLETE @ 152%

Having met their first goal set in 2018, the LCSD Committee in January of 2019 set a goal to raise \$21,000 by 2021. At the close of 2020, the two-year effort to increase the Lyme Central Scholarship Endowment Fund by \$21,000 ended with \$31,815 raised or 152% of the established goal. The LCS alumni, students, retirees, and community are to be CONGRATULATED and THANKED for making this happen.

THE LYME CENTRAL SCHOLARSHIP

ENDOWMENT FUND is maintained at the Northern

NY Community Foundation. Funds are invested in stocks & bonds and a 4% distribution (based on a 16-quarter average balance) is available each year for scholarships. The past 15 yr. average rate of return has been 7+% which allows the fund to grow over time even after the deduction of a ¾ % annual management fee and the 4% scholarship distribution.

WILL/BEQUEST: If you are making or updating a Will please consider designating an amount for the Lyme Central Scholarship Fund, % the Northern NY Community Foundation. Remember even small amounts can be magnified greatly when numerous individuals make such a commitment.

A NAMED SCHOLARSHIP can be arranged when a gift or bequest of \$10,000 or more is designated. A minimum gift of \$10,000 will establish an annual \$400 scholarship in perpetuity.

MEMORIAL/HONOR DONATIONS: When the cumulative total donations in memory/honor of an individual reach \$500 their name will be placed on a perpetual plaque in the school lobby.
